

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THE LORD IS YOUR REFUGE

I sought the Lord and He heard me and delivered me from all my fears -Psalm 34:4

A couple of years back someone got shot in my neighbourhood and to this day the reason is still unknown, but that struck fear in my heart because I live in a quiet neighbourhood where such events are unheard of, so it makes sense why I'd be afraid.

At the time of the shooting, another crime crept in where electricity cables (copper wires) were being stolen left, right and centre with residents living without power for a few days, weeks and sometimes months!

People were making reports of how the cable thieves would make threats if they were seen by residents Authorities warned us as residents to stay indoors at all costs even if we heard any movement at night.

This is a problem not only affecting my neighbourhood but the rest of the city, but all of us are concerned for the safety of our lives, jobs/careers, relationships, family, future etc.

The more we think about our fears the more we expect failure or disappointment, and all hope is lost, but that's only in our minds.

The first step to overcoming our fears is to seek God by understanding that we cannot tackle the challenges that life throws at us on our own especially when we have tried to, and we failed over and over.

But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.

- Matthew 6:33

When we seek God first and put our trust in Him, He will not hesitate to come to our rescue. When all these fears started growing in my neighbourhood my faith, and trust in God started growing too, because I knew and know very well that in every single thing that happens on Earth no matter how great or small it may be, God has the final say in it.

And when words failed I turned to His Word, and meditated on it, and used it as a prayer, Psalms 91 is a great prayer for protection and in verses 3 and 4 it says:

Surely He shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler And from the perilous pestilence. He shall cover you with His feathers, And under His wings, you shall take refuge; His truth shall be your shield and buckler. God loves you and He will always take care of you.


1: What does the testing of our faith produce?

GOD'S GRACE AND MERCY IN TIMES OF NEED

Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Hebrews 4:16

You might be struggling with sin or you probably gave into temptation recently, and it feels like you have backslidden or you don't have a relationship with God at all, but the thing is that God is there for you, He cares for you and He will never abandon you.

God is perfect in justice and in mercy, meaning there is always a second chance and He is always willing to forgive our sins because we can't sin beyond God's forgiveness. Paul formerly Saul is a great example of that.

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

- 1 John 1:9

When we have sinned and find ourselves in times of trouble, we might assume that it's a punishment from God and we might be right about that, but it doesn't last forever, because it is for our own good, not to torment us.

'My son, do not despise the chastening of the Lord, Nor detest His correction; For whom the Lord loves He corrects, Just as a father the son in whom he delights.' - Proverbs 3:11-12

But sometimes we might go through trials and tribulations for different reasons not related to us falling short of God's glory. It could be a storm that is meant to help us grow in our faith just like what happened with disciples at sea in Matthew 8:24-27. With every circumstance. God has a reason and it all brings Him glory and if you abide by His word and put your trust in Him, it will bring you honour in the eyes of God and the eyes of men.

And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong.' -2 Corinthians 12:9-10

Let not mercy and truth forsake you; Bind them around your neck, Write them on the tablet of your heart, And so find favour and high esteem In the sight of God and man.' - Proverbs 3:3-4

God forgives and He takes good care of the ones who choose to obey Him. We are not perfect, and we will find ourselves in moments of weakness, but it is not the end of the world.

Turn to Christ and keep your eyes focused on Him, and He will come to your rescue. This however is not an excuse to fall short and sin against Him. Choose to love Him and obey Him and always keep your faith in Him.

HE QUIETS THE STORM

'But He said to them, "Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?" Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. '

- Matthew 8:26

Trials and tribulations are good for us, because they teach us to be patient, and to have perseverance, this gives us strength and leads us closer to God. These are good for us and our spirits understand this, but our flesh doesn't and during times of trouble we tend to lose faith in God and our doubt increases.

We must remember the God we serve, how powerful He is, and how He can handle any situation we face, but somehow we don't, and that clouds our judgement and leads us to make irrational decisions.

When the disciples and Jesus were at sea in Matthew 8, a storm invoked great fear in their hearts because they assumed they were going to die.

But as we know they didn't die, because Jesus came to their rescue when they turned to Him. They knew that they couldn't save themselves, and that they needed the one who is greater and who can control the world that He created, because they themselves are His creation.

And suddenly a great tempest arose on the sea, so that the boat was covered with the waves. But He was asleep. Then His disciples came to Him and awoke Him, saying, "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" - Matthew 8:24-25

When you face hardships and challenges in your life who do you turn to? What is the first thing that comes to your mind? Do you choose to handle the matter yourself or do you run to God and ask for His intervention?

It is humanly logical for us to immediately take matters into our own hands but the question is, what do you do when you fail to handle it on your own? Do you call for reinforcements?

As Christ's followers, one thing that we must always keep in mind is that we are not on our own, our God is there for us. Our flesh may tell us that a certain issue is too small to give it up to God but that is where we make our first mistake. What do we do when the issue gets bigger? One thing we must know is that God wants us to turn to Him no matter how great or small a situation is, be it trying to find a missing sock or to find the money that's missing from our bank accounts.

Nothing is too big or too small for God to handle and He wants to help us at all times, Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; - Phil 4:6

In the verse above we are told to pray to God about everything, not a few things or some things but everything. Every little detail about your life. The disciples after Jesus had ascended performed miracles and shared the word of God without fear even though they faced persecution and died terrible deaths for proclaiming their faith.

When they preached they were now bolder because they trusted in Christ.
When they faced a storm they ran to Him and even when He left they moved by faith trusting in Him with no doubt in their hearts.

For we walk by faith, not by sight. - 2 Cor 5:7

Discussion:


1: What is the first thing we must do when we face a crisis?

Sometimes we try to resolve the concerns by taking matters into our own hands by finding a Plan B or giving up, but then whatever solution we try might result in more failure, and more worries. However, God calls. us to put our trust in Him by first humbling ourselves, and turning away from our fleshly methods to casting our cares upon Him. When we worry we bring no value to ourselves, but when we trust God, we know whatever happens is according to His will, and for good reason.

Pride can hold us back from moving forward, but when we choose to not worry about what people will think or say that is when we start to win. And whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted. - Matthew 23:12

Instead of worrying pray,

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. - Philippians 4:6

And meditate on His word.

This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success. - Joshua 1:8


1: What sometimes holds us back from moving forward?

THE LORD IS YOUR COMFORTER

Blessed are those who mourn, For they shall be comforted. - Matthew 5:4

Losing a family member, job, relationship etc can be really painful especially if we were dependent on them. Others may be bullied at school, abused at home or even at church sometimes.

Pain comes in different ways from varying circumstances and it can be very difficult to deal with it. Sometimes we might feel shame for asking for help or comfort from others because they might not relate or be able to help.

I myself was bullied for most of my childhood and teenage years and abused by family members both emotionally and physically. At school, I was always involved in fights or picked on by the bigger boys. At home, I was emotionally abused and insulted and I couldn't really get help except from my mother and my sister but as a

young boy that was seen as a weakness by other boys at school, regardless I felt no shame because they love me and they have always had my back.

My mother always recommended I read scripture and pray but at the time I wasn't even a believer and yet God came to me through my true family and friends. In my last year of high school,

I met a friend who encouraged me and taught me the scriptures and the next year (2018) I started attending church but I truly gave my life to Christ a year (2019) after I started attending church. Even after repentance, I was still in grief and traumatized by the pain I had experienced.

Depression was high but the more I started meditating on God's word the less depressed I felt and the more peace I had. I had a fear of failure, of death and even of people but Christ took that away and gave me peace.

God will always be there for you if you seek Him, turn to Him and trust in Him. God heals all pain as long as you have faith, even as small as a mustard seed. Don't put your trust in people, possessions or any of the worldly things; put it in the giver and taker of life.

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. - Hebrews 11:1

For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." - Romans 10:11

So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. - Romans 10:17

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. - John 3:16

SHARING GOD'S LOVE

Faith is a very difficult thing to understand for most people and they might ask why should they trust in someone that they can't see. To answer, use this analogy we have all seen a building that is older than us but we have never seen the person who built it. This is the case with most of the buildings we see on a daily basis. So iust because we do not know the builder it does not mean he doesn't exist and this is the same with God (Creator) and creation.

If they ask why does He allow bad things to happen? Use the same analogy, but add this, if a builder builds a building and rents it out. As he rents it out, he gives the tenants a set of rules to follow. and if they break them there'll be consequences. One rule would be do not set a fire in the building, if the tenants set fire, the building will surely burn and it's not the landlord's fault. Breaking the rules is a crime/sin just like how Adam and Eve broke the rules and brought sin into the world.

God doesn't want bad things to happen to us (mainly hell) hence He gave up His one and only Son for our sins, so that we are saved from death and that He takes care of us during times of trouble.
